

Golf Course Report

Greens:

- Greens have just been pencil tined to 3.5 inches to help get more oxygen into the rootzone.
- Over the next two renovations in 2020 we will be concentrating on reducing the volume of moss on the surface and decreasing the levels of thatch in the top 4 inches of the soil profile.
- Greens will receive an application of moss pro killer in the middle of February. This will then be scarified out before renovation week.
- Renovation in March will involve the following practices;
- Greens to be scarified 4mm deep using 2mm tungsten carbide tipped blades.
- ▶ Hollow core to 4 inches using 12mm diameter side eject tines
- ▶ Bentgrass seed at 5g/m² drop spread over aeration holes and brushed in on greens.
- ▶ Greens to be vertidrained using 12mm diameter tines to a depth of 8inches.
- All greens to be topdressed using compatible USGA Specification sand which will be brushed in afterwards.

Golf Course report continued...

Fairways and Tees

- ▶ Fairways are starting to dry out nicely over the past week.
- First cut of the year on lakes on Tuesday this week and hoping to get Woods course cut by Friday.
- ▶ The club has recently purchased a Charterhouse Vertidrain to aerate the fairways. This will help decompact the soil profile, encourage deeper rooting of the turfgrass plant, improve nutrient availability and help with drainage going into the Autumn and Winter of 2020.
- ▶ Vertidraining of all fairways will take place week commencing the 13th Jan. This is subject to delivery being on schedule. We are hoping to have completed the aeration of fairways, approaches and tees by the end of February.

Tree and Pond work

- ▶ Pond clearance has been completed on holes 2, 12 and 18. This involved cutting back the dead Bulrush which will allow the new leaves to come through in the spring. We have also started a 3 year cycle of cutting back willow species around ponds. These willows that have been pruned back will also regenerate in April.
- Pond work has now started on the 8th Lakes.
- ▶ Tree work will continue on the course during January and February.
- ▶ Wood chip from the Tree work will be put down on paths around the course. The first ones to be done will be the paths on the 4th,5th and 8th.

Golf Course report continued

Irrigation Work

- All defective sprinklers have been replaced on the Lakes Greens.
- We are due to replace the remaining defective sprinklers on the Woods Greens in early march.
- The irrigation tank has recently had a new liner and Roof installed.
- Last summer the irrigation system was not operating at the correct pressure which meant we had dry areas on some greens. Two new Hydrovars (Variable speed drives) which help regulate the pressure of the irrigation pumps are getting replaced in February. The pipework in the irrigation store is also getting replaced. This will provide us with a more consistent pressure operating the sprinklers and mean we can run the two greens at the same time without reducing the overall pressure.
